Whereas complaint on oath has been made to me  
by David Lipscomb that he has just reason to believe  
and does verily believe that Catharine a slave of the  
said David Lipscomb did on the night of the 26<sup>th</sup>  
Inst. in the District aforesaid wilfully, maliciously  
& feloniously set fire to & burn his stables with four  
head of horses, a quantity of fodder and shucks

There are therefore to require you forthwith to ar-  
rest the said Catharine & bring her before me or the  
next Magistrate of said District at the said David  
Lipscombs on the first day of February by 10 o'clock  
A.M. to be dealt with according to law
