Greenville, S. C. Feb 2<sup>nd</sup> 1865

Sir,

We arrived at this place with our train last night, and unloaded at these works.

No reliable information has been received at this place from Columbia. Several parties have started down, writing from Newberry that 2/3 of the town had been burned, and the people in a starving condition. Waggons were then at Newberry, sent by the Mayor of Columbia for provisions, they were to be loaded and start

back to day. Nickerson  
and Jacob Fister had  
gone with the enemy.  
I go to work at once  
preparing to Manufacture  
Percussion Caps.

Mr LK Saso, died on  
yesterday, at Batesville  
near this place. Inflammation  
of Stomach and Brain,  
to be buried here tomorrow.
