send full programme of movements
I propose to meet your orders

Lincolnton N.C. My boy Syas in
Wimsboro bring him with you he has
Vah Heywards horse Col Sloan has
telegraphed Tupper that Marshall is here
with orders to inspect & proceed to Newbury
but no such man has been ordered
